PRESENTATION:

Executive Flight Office Layout Concepts – Ellyn Freed & Lenka Slapnika of Forte Architects provided a presentation on Phase III Executive Flight office layout concepts. The Phase III project would focus on the portion of the building not occupied by Regional Port staff and include potential leasable office and garage space. Commissioners provided feedback on the four proposed layout options that were presented and more discussions will occur at a later date.

Director Loebsack excused for a prior engagement.

CDRPA INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

Waterville Airport Runway Improvement Project Bid Results – Moyers reminded the Board that staff was authorized to seek bids for the Waterville Airport pavement maintenance project. The project is being funded primarily through a WSDOT Aviation Grant. The bid opening was September 17th. Only one bid was received and the bid exceeded the Engineer's estimate. Staff is awaiting a response from the WSDOT on whether the bid can be awarded as submitted in order to complete the work this year, or rebid the project in 2021. A question concerning availability of grant funding in 2021 was discussed.

It is the Regional Port Board of Director's preference to rebid the project in 2021 if WSDOT will provide assurances that grant funding will be available. In the event WSDOT will not provide said assurances for funding in 2021, the following actions were taken:

On November 12, 2019, the Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority Board of Directors adopted a policy governing capital investments for real property owned by either the Port of Chelan County or Port of Douglas County. Section 2 of that policy states if there is joint financing for the capital investment equal to or over \$1.0 million, the Board of Directors is required to adopt an Ownership Allocation Memo as a means to allocate respective ownership interests in the property in the event of a dissolution.

The Board of Directors seeks to rebuild the HVAC system at the Executive Flight building at a total projected cost of \$1.5 million. Federal CARES Act grant funds will be used for the entirety of the HVAC rebuild. Neither the Port of Chelan nor the Port of Douglas will be issuing separate debt or entering into a joint financing plan for the capital improvement.

Because the source of funds for the capital investment will not be financed by either port district, there is no ownership allocation change.

The Port of Chelan County remains the 100% owner of the Executive Flight building. The Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority shall manage the Executive Flight building pursuant to and consistent with CDRPA Resolution 2020-02.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

At the request of FAA staff, and per the FAA's September 27, 2012 Memorandum - Interim Guidance on Land Uses Within a Runway Protection Zone, a Runway Protection Zone (RPZ) analysis will need to be completed concurrently with the Pangborn Memorial Airport's on-going Environmental Assessment (EA) process. The RPZ analysis report is designed to evaluate potential alternatives that focuses on minimizing, mitigating and/or eliminating incompatible land uses, people, and property within the proposed RPZ. Information from the 2019 approved Airport Layout Plan will be utilized to assist in this RPZ analysis process.

This task includes the evaluation of alternatives for minimizing, mitigating, and/or eliminating incompatible land uses within the proposed Runway 12 RPZ utilizing the FAA's September 27, 2012 Memorandum - *Interim Guidance on Land Uses Within a Runway Protection Zone*. The triggering event for this analysis is the consideration of a larger RPZ surface to accommodate lower visibility minimums with the installation of a Medium Approach Light System with Runway Alignment Indicator Lights (MALSR). At the conclusion of producing the RPZ analysis report, the document will be forwarded to the FAA Seattle ADO for agency coordination at the ADO, Regional, and HQ levels for concurrance.

This policy is established with the purpose of providing staff with guidance from the Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority Board of Directors for obtaining health insurance coverage for 2021, with the intent of keeping costs reasonable for the Port Authority while still providing coverage for employees that meets or exceeds current coverage.

Staff recommends the following actions with approval of the policy:

- (1) Approve Regional Port Authority paid coverage for Commissioners, employees and families.
- (2) Approve the Washington Counties Insurance Fund "Heritage Plus Plan" for 2021.
- (3) Approve WCIF VSP Standard Plan for vision coverage.
- (4) Approve Delta Dental of Washington (DDW) Plan D-4 for dental coverage.
- (5) Approve \$100,000 of life insurance coverage for each employee and elected official.
- (6) Approve HRA VEBA Contribution of \$500 per month if a Regional Port Authority Employee or Elected Official elects out and provides documentation of other coverage (not available to Medicare recipients).
- (7) Approve a Health Reimbursement Plan for out-of-pocket expenses to be reimbursed after an individual reaches \$2,000 in expenses or a family reaches \$4,000 in expenses.
- (8) Authorize the 2020 budget to establish the reimbursement pool at 20% of the potential liability at \$28,800.
- (9) Approve Vimly, Inc. as the HRA manager for the Health Reimbursement Accounts (\$5.25 per employee per month paid by the RPA).

Land Use Planning Review

Boundary Line Adjustment

The Airport has some 36 plus parcels of property including a host of parcels acquired during the Runway Extension Project. The Regional Port needs to undertake a comprehensive Boundary Line Adjustment. The goal is to reconfigure parcel boundaries to more accurately reflect current uses and to create future opportunities. This will be beneficial as the Airport develops in the future.

Timeline: We can start this process now. Goal for completion and adoption by Douglas County March/April 2021.

Airport Land Use Compatibility and Density (Airport Overlay Zone)

Current compatibility & density rules adopted in 2008. Model after California Land Use Planning Manual.

California has updated its planning manual which is more flexible. Policy issue for the Board to review during first quarter of 2021.

If Board wants to proceed with the revised California Model, what is the best way to proceed?

- Could be a separate rezone request.
- · Combine with the other zoning and planning efforts for entire PISA.

Amendment to Douglas County Comprehensive Plan

- Expand the Pangborn Industrial Service Area (PISA).
- Add a Pangborn Airport Development District as a new chapter in County Code.
 - Protect/Reserve Aviation Use Property.

 Remainder of Airport Property – seek a broad use table to include commercial, some limited retail, light industrial, warehouse, and distribution, etc al.


*Douglas County wants to engage the CDRPA in a broader planning discussion regarding PISA and potential amendments for economic development purposes.

Pump Testing

Irrigation Technology & Control Inc. (ITC) was hired by the Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority (RPA) to conduct a 4-hour step test and investigate the pump details at the existing well on the LOJO property as part of the potential sale of the property to the RPA.

RH2 Engineering, Inc., (RH2) was hired by RPA to oversee the pump testing.

Results

Step Pump Test

ITC was able to remove the existing irrigation pump and confirm that there was a single 60 horsepower (hp) submersible pump that was a Berkeley Model 7T-500. The bottom of the motor is set at 292 feet below the top of the casing.

While pulling the existing pump, ITC discovered that the well casing was bent. The casing starts to deflect at approximately 80 feet below the top of the casing. ITC was unable to determine the direction or extent of the deflection. ITC was able to install both an airline and a ¾-inch polyvinyl chloride transducer drop pipe for measuring water levels in the future. ITC used the airline to measure water levels during the pump test.

ITC completed three steps as part of the test. A summary of the results is show in Figure 1.

Pump Test Summary

The graph shows that from a static water level of 198.75 feet below the top of the casing, the water level only dropped approximately 3 feet over the duration of the test, even at the highest pumping rate possible with the existing well (555 gallons per minute (gpm)). The recovery was relatively instantaneous (unable to take measurement between turning the pump off and full recovery).

For additional information see attachments containing well log data, ITC test results, and pump curve data.

Water Quality

At the conclusion of the pump test, RH2 collected a water quality sample and submitted it to Cascade Analytical, Inc., for analysis. Results indicate that the water is generally high quality but contains moderate levels of nitrates (2.57 mg/L) and high hardness (198 mg/L). Full results are included in Attachment 4.

Conclusion

The existing well is approximately 10 years old, has a 60 hp submersible pump, and likely represents the largest pump capable of being installed within this well. The casing deflection prevents vertical turbine style pumps from being installed.

The well is very productive, but it is machine slotted (an inefficient form of well completion), meaning it likely could yield significantly more than that which the existing pump is capable. Based on preliminary modeling using the Cooper-Jacobs modified Theis equation, it is estimated a large efficient well may be capable of up to 3,000 gpm.

Water quality within the aquifer tapped by the well is of high quality and suitable for drinking water.




